Careers Lea introduced.  • Weekly employability classes start for year 1, 2 and 3 – run throughou the year.  • Weekly 'job club' for year 3 begins- job searching and interview suppor runs weekly for all year 3s throughout the year until they find paid work.  • Work experience placements typically begin (on hold due to COVID-19 Some learners starting/continuing with voluntary work experience (i.e. foodbank, charity shop).  October  • National Customer Service Week 5th-9th Oct- focus in employability classes on roles within the customer service industry, skills and qualitie needed to work in customer service industry, skills and qualitie needed to work in customer service.  • Year 3 learners offered opportunities to attend Virtual Jobs Fair -Nation Careers Service.
